Keeping Critical Drainage Lines Clear



While standing or slow draining water is not uncommon during large rain events, water collecting in the streets that does not recede within several hours could be a sign of hidden problems. Last year, a resident contacted WFDD about localized street flooding near their neighborhood entrance, prompting televising of storm sewer lines that revealed invasive tree roots nearly 10 inches in diameter. Further inspections nearby revealed even more roots, sparking development of a plan to examine all WFDD owned storm sewer lines, manholes and inlets. In year one of its comprehensive five-year plan to inspect and ensure the integrity of its system, WFDD is helping maintain

effective drainage infrastructure by identifying and correcting issues before they could lead to water backup.
