WILLOW FORK DRAINAGE DISTRICT PARK MATTERS

December 16, 2020

The Board of Directors (the "Board") of Willow Fork Drainage District (the "District") met by teleconference, with access by telephone available to the public, pursuant to Texas Government Code Section 551.125 and Governor Greg Abbott's emergency disaster declaration dated March 13, 2020, in regular session, open to the public, on December 16, 2020, and the roll was called of the members of the Board:

and all of the above were present, thus constituting a quorum.

Also present at the meeting were Fran Matuska of F. Matuska, Inc.; Matt Klein of TBG Partners; Christine Reeves and Andrew Dunn of On-Site Protection LLC; Craig Kalkomey of LJA Engineering; Jerry Schroeder and Dawn Mouton, of Champions Hydro-Lawn, Inc. ("Champions"); Yvonne Arceneaux; Robert Serrett, a member of the public; Neil Stillman, Friends of the Park; and Harry H. Thompson and Linda Sotirake of Allen Boone Humphries Robinson LLP.

Mr. Thompson reviewed certain recommended protocols for conducting the District's meeting via teleconference and reminded the attendees that the meeting was being recorded. He announced that the consultant reports presented at the meeting were posted online and available to the public in the form of an "agenda packet" prior to the start of the meeting at www.districtdirectory.org/agendapackets/wfdd/.

UPDATE ON COVID19 MATTERS

Mr. Thompson updated the Board regarding COVID19 matters and District operations and stated the District is still operating under the emergency orders of the Fort Bend and Harris County Judges.

COMMENTS FROM THE PUBLIC

Mr. Serrett congratulated Directors Duncan and Robinson on their re-election. He stated that he believes there needs to be sod added to the Barton Meadow Crossing.

MINUTES

The Board next considered approving the minutes of the November 18, 2020, parks meeting. Director Poulter moved to approve the minutes as submitted. Director Robinson seconded the motion, which carried unanimously.

SECURITY REPORT

Ms. Reeves reviewed with the Board the security report. She noted that a woman was hit on the head with a golf frisbee. In response to a question from Ms. Mouton regarding the location of the frisbee golf hole, Ms. Reeves stated that she would find out that information.

Mr. Dunn reported that the installation of an additional camera, pole, and lights at the restroom in Exploration Park is proceeding.

FRIENDS OF THE PARK

Mr. Stillman reported that two information panels will be installed in Butterfly Garden in March. Discussion ensued regarding possible projects for the Eagle Scouts.

BOOKKEEPER'S REPORT

Ms. Matuska reviewed the bookkeeper's report for parks, a copy of which is attached, including the checks presented for payment. She then reviewed check no. 4816 payable to Division III in the amount of \$46,333.80. After review and discussion, Director Poulter moved to approve the bookkeeper's report and payment of the bills. Director Robinson seconded the motion, which passed by unanimous vote.

CHAMPIONS MAINTENANCE REPORT

Mr. Schroeder reviewed the maintenance report for parks, a copy of which is attached, and updated the Board regarding the status of facilities and ongoing maintenance and repairs.

He then reviewed the revised budget for Buffalo Bayou Trail Segments J, K, L, M, S, V and T. After review and discussion, Director Nady moved to approve the revised budget. Director Smith seconded the motion, which carried unanimously.

Director Nady requested budget information for all trail segments.

CONSENT TO CONTAINMENT OF FERAL HOGS

There was no discussion on this matter.

LANDSCAPE ARCHITECT REPORT

- Mr. Klein reviewed the landscape architect report, a copy of which is attached. He stated a map of the trails is included in the report.
 - Mr. Klein updated the Board regarding the Central Green Shade Structure.
 - Mr. Klein updated the Board regarding the trail signage and wayfinding.
- Mr. Klein updated the Board regarding the Exploration Park Bathroom project. He recommended approval of Change Order No. 2 to the contract with D.L. Meacham, L.P. for the Exploration Park Bathroom project to increase the contract in the amount of \$9,206.00. The Board determined that Change Order No. 2 is beneficial to the District. After review and discussion, Director Nady moved to approve Change Order No. 2 in the amount of \$9,206.00 as an increase to the contract with D.L. Meacham, L.P., based upon the Board's finding that the Change Order is beneficial to the District and TBG's recommendation. The motion was seconded by Director Smith and carried by unanimous vote.
- Mr. Klein updated the Board regarding Trails Package 2. He stated that the contractor has not completed the punchlist items.
- Mr. Klein updated the Board regarding Trails Package 3. He stated that the contractor has not completed the punchlist items.

ENGINEERING REPORT

- Mr. Kalkomey discussed engineering matters. A copy of the engineering report is attached.
- Mr. Kalkomey updated the Board regarding the mid-block crossing project. He recommended approval of Pay Estimate No. 2 in the amount of \$44,359.20 submitted by Division III. After review and discussion, and based on the engineer's recommendation, Director Nady moved to approve Pay Estimate No. 2 in the amount of \$44,359.20. Director Poulter seconded the motion
- Mr. Kalkomey updated the Board regarding desilting the final 8200 linear feet of the Diversion Channel.
- Mr. Kalkomey stated that he had nothing new to report regarding the Infrastructure Fund Application. Mr. Thompson reported ABHR and LJA were still coordinating the necessary memoranda of understanding and support letters for the application.

Mr. Kalkomey also stated that he had nothing new to report regarding the pilot project in the Barker Reservoir.

Mr. Kalkomey reported that the District received bids for clearing for the Westheimer Parkway underpass. He reviewed the bids submitted by the two lowest bidders. After discussion, the Board deferred award of the contract.

REPORT FROM EVENTS DIRECTOR

Ms. Arceneaux reviewed with the Board a calendar of events for 2021.

PARKS COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATIONS

Director Smith reported that the Board would like to recognize the outstanding job that Ms. Arceneaux has done this past year, and award a Christmas bonus reflective of such performance.

COMMUNICATIONS MATTERS

There was no discussion on this matter.

CURRENT EVENTS

Director Robinson discussed current events regarding COVID19 issues and a possible vaccine.

BUFFALO BAYOU AND TRIBUTARIES RESILIENCY STUDY INTERIM FEASIBILITY REPORT

Mr. Thompson reported that, pursuant to the Board's direction, Houston Stronger is using the District's logo in its correspondence to the United States Army Corps of Engineers related to the study. Mr. Thompson updated the Board on the status of public comments related to the study.

REVIEW ACTION LIST AND DISCUSS MEETING SCHEDULE AND ITEMS FOR INCLUSION ON NEXT AGENDA

The Board concurred to hold the next parks meeting on January 28, 2020.

EXECUTIVE SESSION

At 1:13 p.m., the Board convened in Executive Session pursuant to Section 551.071 for consultation with attorney regarding contemplated litigation and potential settlement options.

OPEN SESSION

At 1:29 p.m., the Board reconvened in Executive Session. Director Nady moved to authorize ABHR to prepare a letter to Division III regarding completion of punchlist items for Trails Package 2 and approve a settlement agreement with MoBill and MoBill's surety for Trails Package 3, subject to final review. Director Smith seconded the motion, which carried unanimously.

There being no further business to come before the Board, the meeting was adjourned

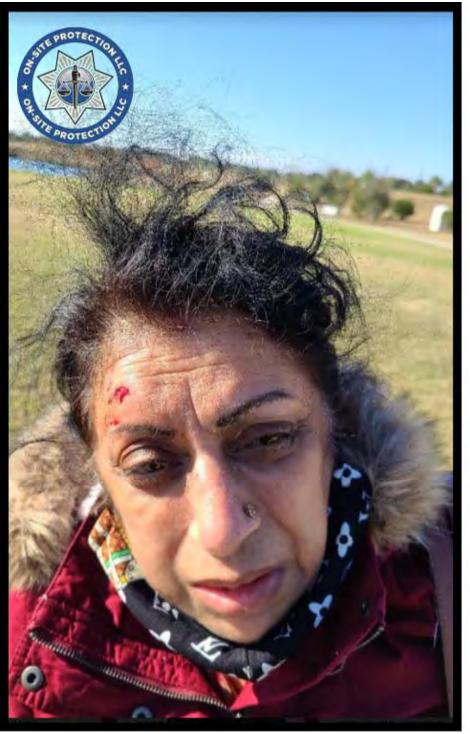


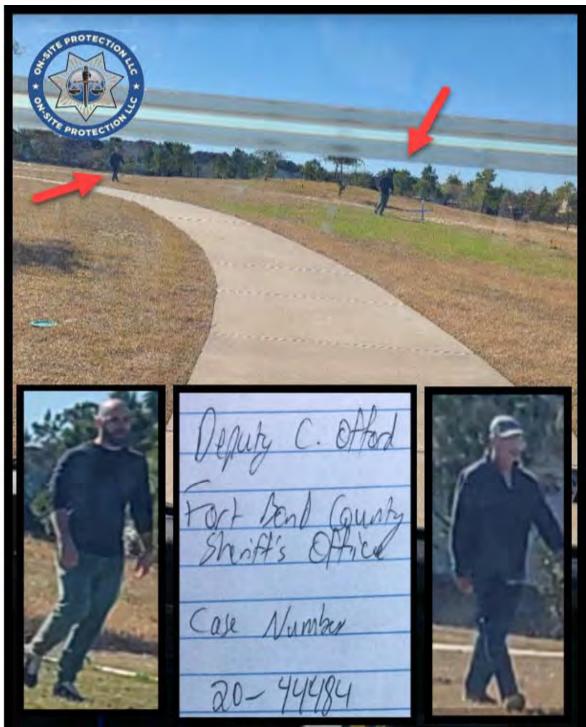












Officer Comments 11.16.20 - 12.5.20

Aramis Gonzales;

On November 16, 2020, I rode the levy and had no incidents with unauthorized motor vehicles.

I first rode the levee to Cinco Ranch High School and checked the Willow Fork Park where I sat for a while and noted eleven cars in the adjacent parking lot.

I observed and noted several trucks and heavy tractor equipment on the levee from Fort Bend County Drainage.

I further rode and sat for a while near the overpass on Cinco Ranch Rd. due to reports of criminal mischief under the bridge area.

I rode back to the levee and sat near Peek Rd. and the levee watching the walking trail.

I further rode to and sat by Rodger and Ellen Beck Junior High near the walking trail.

I further rode to and parked near the diversion channel and the walkover bridge between Fry Rd. and Peek Rd. due to complaints of four-wheeler traffic.

I then rode to the Freedom Park in the George Bush Park on the water control district levee.

I then rode through and checked Camp Cinco. I further rode through and checked the YMCA camp and trail that lead to the levee.

I then rode and sat between Exploration Park and the Ballard House towards the end of the shift. I noted seven cars parked in the parking lot.

I encountered no unauthorized motor vehicles on the levee on this date.

On November 17,2020 I rode the levy and had no incidents with unauthorized motor vehicles.

I first rode to and sat between Banning Point Ct and Litchfield Bend Ln. on the levee. I observed and noted several trucks and heavy tractor equipment on the levee from Fort Bend County Drainage on this date

I then rode the levee to Willow Fork Park and checked the perimeter of the park. While parked at the front near the parking lot I noted twenty-three cars in the adjacent park lot. Further located in the parking lot was a truck, trailer with lawn equipment and workers in the front portion of the park.

I further rode and sat for a while near the overpass on Cinco Ranch Rd. due to reports of criminal mischief under the bridge area. No incidents to report on this date.

I then rode to and sat between Stansbury Place Ln. and Summer Edge Ln. near the Grand Parkway.

I further rode to and parked near the diversion channel and the walkover bridge between Fry Rd. and Peek Rd. due to complaints of four-wheeler traffic.

I then rode to and sat for a while at Wellbrook Ln. and Arbor Stream Ln on the levee.

I rode to and sat for a while near Cassidy Park Ln. and S. Mason Rd.

I further rode to Westheimer Parkway and checked Fisherman's Trail and Bayou View Trail on the water control district levee.

I rode and sat between The Ballard House and Sue Creech Elementary towards the end of the shift. I checked Exploration Park and noted nine cars parking in the lot. I encountered no unauthorized motor vehicles on the levee on this date.

Chris Bronsell;

On Wednesday, November 18, 2020, I, Deputy C. Bronsell, badge #341, worked extra employment for Willow Fork Drainage District from 3pm until 6pm. I began by patrolling the levee behind Kilpatrick Elementary. I patrolled around Highland playground, pool, and basketball court. I headed East along the Bayou Northside Trail. I observed new graffiti on the cement embankment, near the dead end of Sandi Ln. I headed North along the levee and sat stationary near the 3300 block of Falcon Landing. I observed 4 wheeler tracks in this area, however, I believe they were from a side-by-side being used by the construction workers who were still on location working. I then sat stationary on the levee behind Glenthorpe Ln. I continued East and sat stationary on the levee at the intersection of Cinco Ranch Blvd. While at this location, I observed a green dirt bike, with an individual wearing a full face black helmet, and black riding gear, traveling South down Cinco Ranch Blvd. He never got on the levee, but may be an issue later. I heard Pct.#3 Constables get into a pursuit with this motorcycle, a short time later, in which they lost sight of him going North on 99 at Kingsland Blvd. I patrolled the levee to Exploration Park, making stops at Beck Jr. High and Summer Pointe park. I observed 23 vehicles parked in the parking lot at Exploration Park. I sat stationary in this area. I worked a total of 3 hours. I did not observe any motorized vehicles on the levee during my shift.

On Sunday, November 22, 2020, I worked the levee from 12pm until 5pm. I began by sitting stationary on the levee, near the cul de sac of Banksfield Ct. I traveled underneath Westheimer Pkwy, in which I observed 4 wheeler tracks. I patrolled around Cinco Ranch H.S. and Jr. High. I sat stationary in the parking lot of Willow Fork Park, which contained 33 vehicles. I then sat stationary on the levee, just East of S. Mason Rd, near the golf course. I checked the levee behind Fry Ct, then patrolled around the YMCA Camp Cinco. I patrolled the walking path to Freedom Park, which contained 50 vehicles. I cut through Camp Cinco and arrived at Exploration Park. I sat stationary in the parking lot, which contained 30 vehicles. I then made my way to Beck Jr. High and sat stationary in this area. I worked a total of 5 hours. I did not observe any motorized vehicles on the levee during my shift.

Fernie Flores;

On November 19, 2020, I started the shift at Beck Jr High School where the lot was full with staff and parents. I travelled toward Exploration Park without incident. Exploration Park had 8 vehicles on the lot and medium traffic on the playground. I traveled toward

the YMCA and observed a handful of employees on location. No other activity was observed.

I traveled toward Freedom Park and drove by Beck Jr High School along the way. Foot traffic was mild along the way. Upon arrival at Freedom Park the concession stands were secure and no other activity was observed. I made contact with the grounds manager who advised that there were several teens with large trucks drinking and rutting up the soccer fields. The times were said to be later in the evening on the weekends.

I patrolled the area toward Willow Fork Park with medium foot traffic along the way. Upon my arrival I remained in a high visible location for an extended period. There were 19 vehicles on location. No other activity was observed.

I then traveled to Freedom Park and observed increased foot and bike traffic along the way. Freedom Park was secure and no illegal activity was observed. I stayed in the area for an extended period due to the earlier complaint without incident.

After leaving Freedom Park I traveled the area toward Beck Jr High School without incident. Beck Jr High Schools lot was full with student pickup. Traffic in the area was busy as I patrolled toward Exploration Park. There were 20 vehicles parked on the lot. Exploration Park was busy with children and parents enjoying the weather.

I observed an enduro style red motorcycle traveling toward the YMCA that I knew was closed at this time. The motorcyclist remained on the road and no contact was made. No other activity was observed. I patrolled my way past Beck Jr High School toward Willow Fork Park with the foot traffic increasing later in the evening. Willow Fork Park was busy with 32 vehicles on the lot. I remained in the area for an extended period without incident. I then traveled toward Beck Jr High school for the remainder of my shift without incident.

Tanner Eddleblute;

On November 20, 2020 I started riding the Willow Fork Levee at Kilpatrick Elementary school, I rode over to the Willow Fork Park where I counted about 24 vehicles in the parking lot from about 3:30 pm till 4:00 pm. I sat at Willow Fork Park talking to Jorge with on-site security and he stated that he has had no issues at the park. After I left there I rode the section of the levee which runs by the bowl and Beck Junior High. I made my way down to Exploration Park. While at Exploration Park I counted about 30 vehicles in the parking lot. I then doubled back to the bowl and as I crossed over the pedestrian bridge I saw a young kid having trouble with his bike. I stopped and helped him fix his bike so that he could make it home. After that I rode the section of the levee which runs behind the Willow Fork Country Club and Kelliwood subdivision. I made my way to Freedom Park and down to the tractor bridge. From about 5:50 pm till 6:30 pm I sat at the pedestrian bridge behind Freedom Park to see if I could maybe catch the subjects who were having the campfires at the point. I guess I was too early still because I did not see anyone. I did not see any motorized vehicles on the levee during my shift on the levee.

Brian Schmitt;

On November 21, 2020, I checked the nature trails and viewing platforms.

I patrolled to Exploration Park. I counted 25 vehicles in the parking lot.

I checked the entrance to the YMCA Campgrounds.

I then sat by the Renberg pedestrian bridge for a short time.

I then went to Freedom Park. While at Freedom Park I checked the restrooms/concession area and baseball fields.

Then while traveling to check Willow Fork Park, I struck the edge of the bridge by Peek Rd with the front passenger side tire. Of the course the bridge was just fine, however I bent a bunch of important parts to my buggy. After tinkering for nearly an hour, then realizing the damage is more than a quick fix I limped the buggy back home. Not a great day!

Aramis Gonzales;

On November 23, 2020, I rode the levee and had incidents only with workers on the levee.

Upon beginning my shift I noticed a black Ford F150 four door truck parked on the levee right of way near the Exploration Park. I made contact with the white male who was fishing in the immediate area and advised him that his vehicle was illegally on the levee and asked him to park it 40 feet away in the adjacent parking lot. He compiled and moved the vehicle and continued fishing.

I first rode through Camp Cinco and Exploration Park where I sat for a while watching the walking trail. I noted nine cars in the parking lot adjacent to Exploration Park. I then rode into Freedom Park in George Bush Park on the water control levee district. I checked the baseball fields, parking lots and concession stand. No vehicles in the parking lot.

I then rode and sat by Roger and Ellen Beck Junior High for a while on the levee. I observed and noted heavy equipment on the levee from Fort Bend County Drainage dredging and moving dirt during my shift.

I also parked near the diversion channel and the walkover bridge between Fry Rd. and Peek Rd. due to complaints of four-wheeler traffic.

I further rode to Willow Fork Park where I sat near the front of the parking lot. I further rode and checked the park area perimeter while there. I noted thirty-two cars in the parking lot.

I rode back to the levee and sat near Hamptonshire Ln. and Cinco Ranch Blvd. on the levee watching the walking trail.

I then rode back to the levee and sat between Banning Point Ct. and Litchfield Bend Ln.

I encountered no unauthorized motor vehicles on the levee on this date.

On November 24, 2020, I rode the levee and had no incidents with motor vehicles. I first rode to and sat between Stansbury Place Ln. and Summer Edge Ln. on the levee.

I observed and noted several trucks and heavy equipment on the levee from Fort Bend County Drainage dredging and moving dirt during my shift.

I then rode to Willow Fork Park where I sat for a while observing the parking lot and park area. I noted twenty-four cars in the parking lot.

I checked and sat for a while near the walkover bridge between Fry. Rd and Peek Rd. No incidents to report in this area on this date.

I then rode into Freedom Park in George Bush Park on the water control levee district. I rode to Westheimer Parkway and checked Fisherman's Trail and Bayou View Trail on the levee.

At this point in my shift it started drizzling rain and I parked under Fry Rd. Bridge for approximately thirty minutes waiting for the rain to clear off.

I ended the shift by checking on Exploration Park which had eight vehicles parked in the adjacent parking lot.

I encountered no unauthorized motor vehicles on the levee this date.

Chris Bronsell;

On Wednesday, November 25, 2020, I, Deputy C. Bronsell, badge #341, worked extra employment for Willow Fork Drainage District from 3pm until 6pm. I began by patrolling around Creech Elementary and basketball courts. I patrolled around the "Ballard House" and sat stationary on the levee near Exploration Park. I observed the parking lot to contain 22 vehicles. I patrolled through the YMCA - Camp Cinco. I sat stationary near the bridge, located on the back side of Camp Cinco. I then made my way to Beck Jr High. I patrolled around the school and tennis courts and sat stationary in this area. I then patrolled the levee back towards Exploration Park, stopping at Summer Pointe playground and soccer fields. I worked a total of 3 hours. I did not observe any motorized vehicles on the levee during my shift.

Fernie Flores;

On November 26, 2020, I started the shift at Beck Jr High School where the lot was empty with light foot traffic in the area. I travelled toward Exploration Park without incident. Exploration Park was busy and had 21 vehicles on the lot. The playground was full with several families enjoying the holiday. I traveled toward the YMCA and observed no suspicious activity. No other activity was observed.

I traveled toward Freedom Park and drove by Beck Jr High School along the way. Foot traffic was mild along the way. I was stopped by several citizens enjoying the day and expressing their appreciation for being in the area. Upon arrival at Freedom Park the concession stands were secure and no other activity was observed. I stayed in the area for an extended period without incident. I patrolled my way back to Beck Jr High School to drop off a slice of apple pie that was given to me by a kind resident. I patrolled the area toward Willow Fork Park with. Upon my arrival I remained in a high visible location for an extended period. There were 31 vehicles on location. The park was very busy with heavy foot traffic. Security was on scene in a highly visible position. No other activity was observed.

I then traveled back towards Freedom Park without incident. Freedom Park was secure with two fields in use. I stayed in the area for an extended period without incident.

After leaving Freedom Park I traveled the area toward Exploration Park without incident. I drove by Beck Jr High along the way and observed no illegal activity. Exploration Park had 4 vehicles on the lot with mild traffic.

Tanner Eddleblute;

No Shifts

Brian Schmitt;

On November 29, 2020, I rode to Highland Community Park. No one was at the park. I patrolled behind the King Lakes subdivision. I attempted to go to the area of Falcon Landing blvd. bridge. However with the construction in the area and the heavy rains the past few days the area was impassable.

I then attempted to cross the Bayou North Side trail to go to the Cinco Ranch schools and Willow Fork Park. Once again because of the construction and mud and standing water I was unable to access these parts of the trail system.

I then went to Exploration Park. I counted 6 vehicles in the parking lot.

I then went to the YMCA Campgrounds. At the end of the gravel road I observed a black 4 door passenger vehicle. It was occupied by 2 individuals. They appeared to be in the process of climbing from the backseat to the front seat. I asked them what they were doing and they said they were talking. Then the male said the car was stuck in the mud and they had just gotten the vehicle out. I advised them this wasn't the place to be "talking" and to go ahead and leave the area.

I noticed the gate that leads to the diversion channel was open. I closed and dumby locked the gate.

I then went to Freedom Park. I appeared to be a muddy mess so I didn't go into the park.

I then went and sat by the Renberg pedestrian bridge for approximately an hour or so. I then moved and sat by the tennis courts near Beck Jr High.

It was a cold, windy and muddy day.

I checked the nature trails and viewing platforms the best I could during the shift. I attempted again to get around the mud and standing water on the west side of Cinco Ranch Blvd. but all efforts were to no avail. I debated driving down Cinco Ranch Blvd. to access Willow Fork Park but the traffic today was pretty heavy. I didn't want to risk it so I decided against it.

I then went and sat by the observation deck west of Cinco Ranch Blvd. No activity was observed

I moved and sat by Kilpatrick Elementary. No activity was observed.

No motorized vehicles were observed during the shift.

ATV summaries:

Notes:

On November 29, 2020, I received a text from an individual who I always see on the diversion channel. He is always out on the diversion channel taking pictures and using game cameras to capture wildlife activity. He advised one of his game cameras captured some video of two individuals who were at a pond shooting a slingshot at one

of the very large alligators. He said this occurred on November 17th at approximately 3:44 p.m. He believes the two individuals in the video work for the dredging company that is on the diversion channel. He said he also picked up a 12 pack box full of empty beer cans that were left next to the pond. The individual was very upset to say the least. I advised him I would forward this information to the other officers that work on Willow Fork and to the Willow Fork weekly report. This pond is next to the diversion channel east of the YMCA property. The dredging is east of Mason Road near the Canyon Gate subdivision. I will attach a map pin drop of the pond area. I will also attach photographs I was provided including a close up of the individuals. I was also forwarded a video that he posted to Youtube that I will attempt to attach to the weekly report email.

Aramis Gonzales;

On November 30, 2020, I rode the levy and had no incidents with unauthorized motor vehicles.

I attempted to first ride the levee to Cinco Ranch High School and Willow Fork Park but was unable to do so because of too much mud and equipment blocking the right of way area West of Cinco Ranch Blvd on the levee trail.

I then rode and sat for a while near the overpass on Cinco Ranch Rd. due to reports of criminal mischief under the bridge area.

I observed and noted several trucks and heavy tractor equipment on the levee but no workers were present the entire time during my shift.

I further rode to and parked near the diversion channel and the walkover bridge between Fry Rd. and Peek Rd. due to complaints of four-wheeler traffic.

I rode back to the levee and sat near Peek Rd. and the levee watching the walking trail.

I further rode to and sat by Rodger and Ellen Beck Junior High near the walking trail. I then rode through and checked Camp Cinco. I further rode through and checked the YMCA camp and trail that lead to the levee.

I then rode to the Freedom Park in the George Bush Park on the water control district

I then rode and sat between Exploration Park and the Ballard House towards the end of the shift. I noted three cars parked in the parking lot.

I encountered no unauthorized motor vehicles on the levee on this date.

On December 1, 2020, I rode the levy and had no incidents with unauthorized motor vehicles.

I first rode to and sat between Banning Point Ct and Litchfield Bend Ln. on the levee. I then attempted to ride to Willow Fork Park and again was unable to access the route due to too much mud and equipment blocking the levee West of Cinco Ranch Blvd. Several workers and trucks noted on the levee on this date. I spoke with one of the engineers on site working on the levee improvement and asked him if there were any problems or issues with their equipment being tampered with or moved. He stated he

had none to report at that time but would let us know if any issues were to arise. He further stated that the workers have been locking up and securing tools and equipment to prevent any tampering with equipment.

I further rode and sat for a while near the overpass on Cinco Ranch Rd. due to reports of criminal mischief under the bridge area. No incidents to report on this date.

I then rode to and sat between Stansbury Place Ln. and Summer Edge Ln. near the Grand Parkway.

I further rode to and parked near the diversion channel and the walkover bridge between Fry Rd. and Peek Rd. due to complaints of four-wheeler traffic.

I then rode to and sat for a while at Wellbrook Ln. and Arbor Stream Ln on the levee.

I rode to and sat for a while near Cassidy Park Ln. and S. Mason Rd.

I further rode to Westheimer Parkway and checked Fisherman's Trail and Bayou View Trail on the water control district levee.

I rode and sat between The Ballard House and Sue Creech Elementary towards the end of the shift. I checked Exploration Park and noted six cars parking in the lot. I encountered no unauthorized motor vehicles on the levee on this date.

Chris Bronsell;

On Sunday, December 06, 2020, I, Deputy C. Bronsell, badge #341, worked extra employment for Willow Fork Drainage District from 1pm until 6pm. I began by patrolling the Bayou North Side Trail, sitting stationary near the dead end of Banksfield Ct. I patrolled the levee North and made my way around Cinco Ranch H.S. and Jr. High. I sat stationary in the parking lot of WillowFork Park, with On-Site Security Officer Sam, which was completely full. I then continued North along the levee, crossing Falcon Landing Blvd, and heading towards Roesner Rd, along the South Bank Trail. I then worked my way back, in a Southeast direction, heading towards Exploration Park. While traveling underneath S.H. 99, I observed a small amount of new graffiti. I sat stationary on the levee near Beck Jr. High and Summer Pointe Park. I watched the parking lot of Exploration Park, which was completely full, from a distance. I traveled down Cinco Park Dr, towards the YMCA Camp Cinco, and patrolled the area. While working my way back, I observed a white, Chevy Truck driving along the levee, just East of Cinco Ranch Blvd, near Heritage Grand neighborhood. I made contact with the driver, who worked for the construction company. He was checking on the equipment. I worked a total of 5 hours. I did not observe any motorized vehicles on the levee, besides the one construction worker.

Fernie Flores:

On December 3, 2020, I started the shift at Beck Jr High School where the lot was full with staff vehicles. I traveled towards Exploration Park without incident. Exploration Park had three vehicles on the lot and light traffic in the area. I attempted to travel towards the area of the recent wildlife complaint. The trail in the area was too muddy and couldn't be reached. No other traffic was observed by the Y.M.C.A.

I then traveled towards Beck Jr High School towards Willow Fork Park without incident along the way.

The trails were hard to travel in the construction area due to recent rain. At Willow Fork Park there were 11 vehicles on the lot. Security was on location in a high visibility area. There was medium foot traffic in the area. No other activity was observed.

I then patrolled the area back towards Beck Jr High School without incident. The school lot was full with staff and student pickup as I travelled past. At Exploration Park I observed 14 vehicles on the lot and the park was full with parents and children. I stayed in the area for an extended time without incident.

I patrolled my way back to Willow Fork Park and past Beck Jr High along the way. At Willow Fork Park there were 25 vehicles on location with security patrolling the area. I stayed in the area for an extended period without incident. I travelled back towards Exploration Park and passed Beck Jr High School along the way without incident. There were 10 vehicles at Exploration Park. No other activity was observed. I ended my shift at Beck Jr High School.

The trails were muddy and some areas couldn't be reached due to standing water.

On December 4, 2020, I started the shift at Beck Jr High School where the lot was full with staff vehicles. I traveled towards Exploration Park with several fishermen in the area. Exploration Park had 12 vehicles on the lot with medium park traffic. I traveled towards the Y.M.C.A that was open with employees on location. The wildlife area still couldn't be reached.

I then patrolled towards Freedom Park and past Beck Jr High School along the way without incident.

Freedom Park concession stands were secure and park traffic was light. I stayed in the area for an extended period without incident. The fields were still muddy limiting traffic. I then patrolled towards Willow Fork Park without incident. There were 26 vehicles on location and the park was busy with foot traffic. Security was on location patrolling the area. I remained in the area for an extended period without incident. While on location I was contacted by a male who advised his wife was struck by a "disc" at the park. He stated that he had contacted the Constables office and they called him by phone and never arrived on location. I then contacted a district unit who generated a report. [P203390419 CALL SLIP]. The female had left the location and returned. I observed a bump on the right side of her forehead and an abrasion on her nose. I was in the area for an extended period due to the incident.

I then patrolled my way back to Beck Jr High School that was very busy with student pickup as I patrolled my way past.

At Exploration Park I observed 19 vehicles and the park was busy with several parents and children enjoying the park. I then patrolled towards the Y.M.C.A that had 2 vehicles onlocation. I ended my shift at Beck Jr High School without incident.

Tanner Eddleblute;

No shifts

Brian Schmitt;

On December 5, 2020, I started the shift by Kilpatrick Elementary.

I rode to Highland Community Park.

I then patrolled to Freedom Park. While at Freedom Park I checked the baseball fields and concession/restroom.

I then went to the tractor bridge on the Army Corp. of Engineers Sections.

I went along the trails and stopped at the Renberg pedestrian bridge where I sat for approximately 45 minutes or so.

I checked the nature trails and viewing platforms throughout the shift.

I checked Exploration Park. I counted approximately 10 vehicles in the parking lot.

While at Exploration Park I fixed a slow leak in one of my tires.

I checked the YMCA Campgrounds.

I rode to and then sat by Beck Jr. High School. I sat by Fry Rd. for approximately an hour.

I went to Willow Fork Park. I counted 53 vehicles in the parking lot. I parked by the edge of the parking lot under the tree's close to the Cinco Ranch football fields. While sitting next to the parking lot I noticed a red pick up truck that appeared that the rear window was rolled down. About the same time a couple of guys that were standing a few vehicles down walked over to the truck and then turned and waved at me. I drove over to the location where the pick up was parked and one of the guys stated he thinks someone broke into this truck. The truck was a red F-150 Ford pickup with tan trim. Upon closer observation the drivers side rear window was broken with glass scattered around the rear portion of the interior. The truck was packed with soccer equipment and camping gear throughout the interior of the cab. I did notice that there was not any glass on the ground or on the step rail of the truck. This gave me reason to believe this might have occurred at a different location. I contacted Fort Bend County Sheriff's Office Communications and found out who is the registered owner of the truck. I contacted Sam the Onsite security guard by cell phone and asked if he would ride through the park and ask around for John Scott the owner of the Red F-150. Approximately 10 minutes later Sam called and said he located the owner of the truck. The owner advised the damage occurred earlier at his apartment complex. Case closed.

Sam and I then moved back to the edge of the parking lot and watched the people and vehicles come and go from the park. Approximately an hour later a guy riding a white battery powered bicycle approached Sam and I. The bike rider asked if we had seen two very large dogs come through this area. The guy said about 10 minutes ago the dogs were behind Cinco Ranch High School and Jr. High and they tried to attack two kids. He advised the kids went down into the water of the bayou to get away from the dogs. The guy said he intervened and kept the dogs away from the kids. The guy also said he was afraid of the dogs attacking him because they appeared to be vicious. He finished by saying he called the "police" about 5 minutes ago. I advised him I would go look for the dogs. As I was approaching the area behind the Jr. High I observed a Sheriff's Office patrol unit parked by the pedestrian bridge. The Deputy was walking back across the bridge away from the houses in Falcon Ranch neighborhood. The Deputy advised he saw an open back gate and located the dogs nearby. He advised the dogs were playful but would not go back into the yard. The Deputy said he located a

tennis ball and threw it into the backyard and the dogs chased after the ball into the backyard. The Deputy said he secured the gate and he was now headed to go make contact with the owner of the dogs to advise them their dogs had gotten out. I contacted Sam and advised him if he saw the

guy on the white battery powered bicycle to let him know the dogs have been put up. I then went and sat by Sandi Lane and watched the construction along the diversional channel.

No motor vehicles were observed during the shift

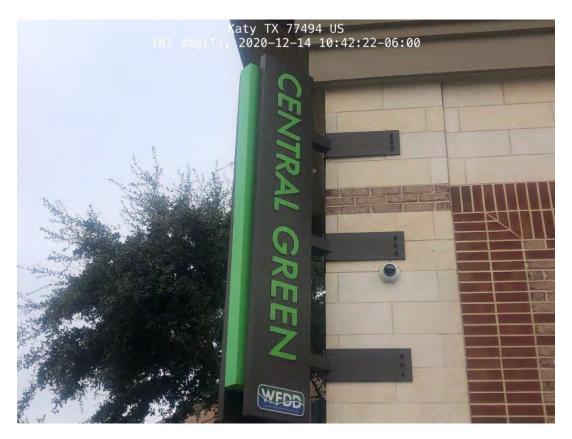

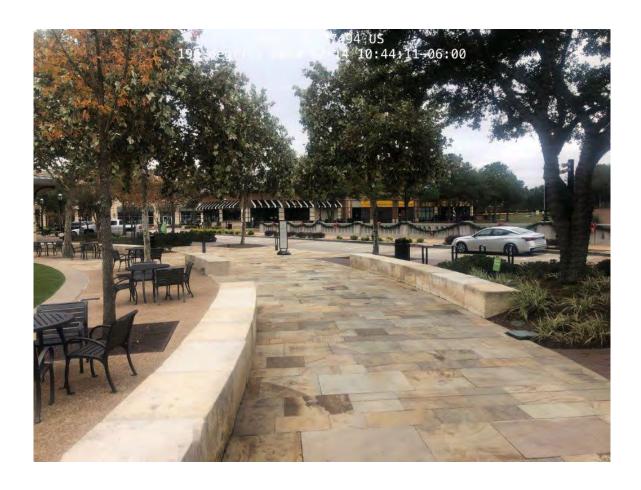

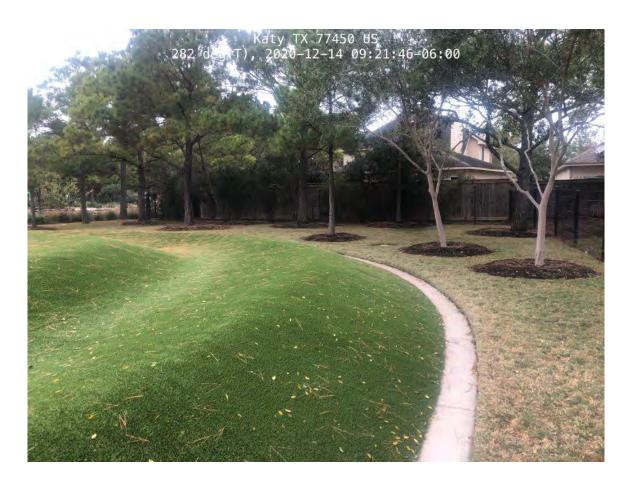
