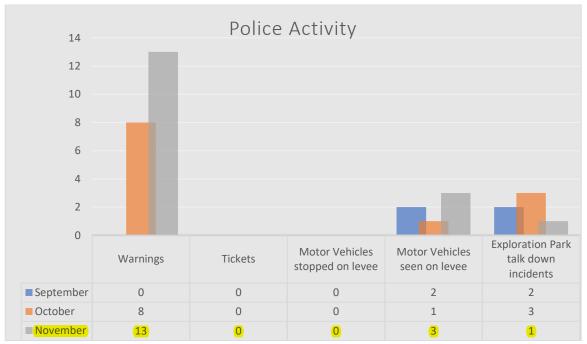

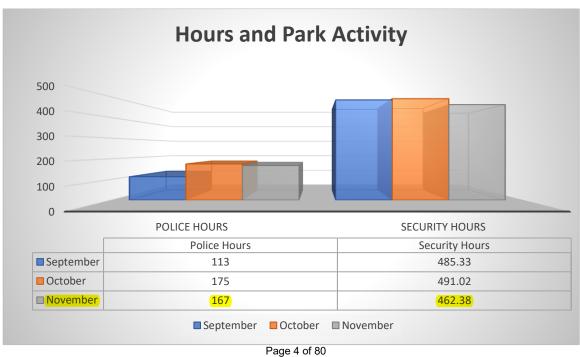

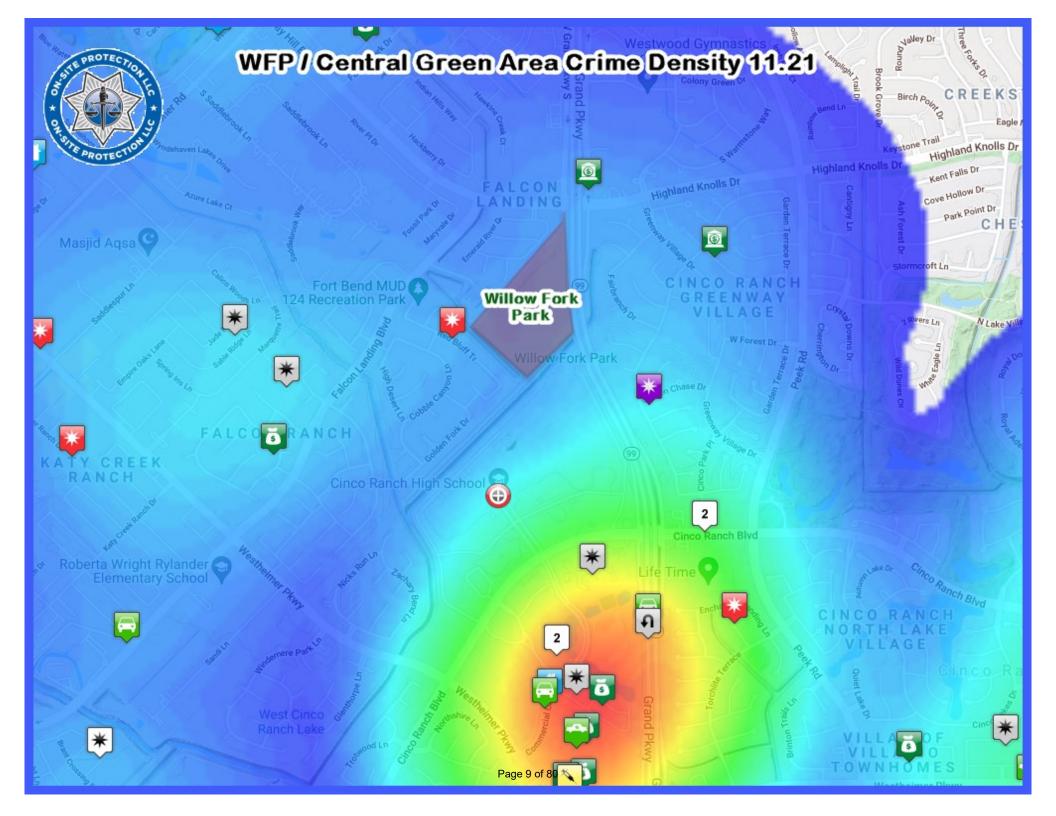

OFFICER COMMENTS November 14 thru December 12

Tim Oxley; (Exploration Park)

On November 14, 2021, No activity was observed.

On November 19, 2021 at 12:28 a.m.

Approximately 15 teen age subjects entered the park. Contact was made with subjects ranging from 16 to 18 years of age. Subjects stated they were attending a Birthday party down the street. Advised of park closure and they left the location.

On November 20, 2021 at 9:57 p.m.

Two teenage males entered the park. No contact was made, both subjects ran as I approached.

At approximately 11:24 pm. A couple in their early twenties parked in the connecting lot and were contacted as they exited their vehicle. Subjects stated they were going to walk the park. They were advised that the park was closed and they left the location.

Aramis Gonzales;

On November 15, 2021, I rode the levee and had no incidents with motor vehicles. I first rode through Camp Cinco and Exploration Park where I sat for a while watching the walking trail. I noted seven vehicles in the parking lot adjacent to Exploration Park.

I then rode into Freedom Park in the George Bush Park on the water control levee district. I checked the baseball fields, parking lots and concession stand. No vehicles were noted in the parking lot on this date.

I then rode and sat by Roger and Ellen Beck Junior High for a while near the levee trail.

I then rode and sat for a while near the overpass on Westheimer Parkway due to reports of criminal mischief under the bridge area. No incidents to report on this date. I further rode to Willow Fork Park where I sat near the front of the parking lot. I further rode and checked the park area perimeter while there. I noted twelve cars in the parking lot.

I rode back to the levee and sat near Hamptonshire Ln. and Cinco Ranch Blvd. on the levee watching the walking trail.

I encountered no unauthorized motor vehicles on the levee on this date.

On November 16, 2021, I rode the levee and had no incidents with motor vehicles. I first rode to and sat between Stansbury Place Ln. and Summer Edge Ln. on the levee.

I then rode to Willow Fork Park where I sat for a while observing the parking lot and park area. I further rode and checked the park perimeter and periodically checked the parking lot area. I noted fourteen cars in the adjacent parking lot next to the park on this date.

I further rode and sat for a while near the overpass on Westheimer Parkway due to reports of criminal mischief under the bridge area. No incidents to report on this date. I further rode and sat at Cassidy Park Ln. and S. Mason Rd. on the levee where I parked for a while watching the walking path.

I checked and sat for a while near the walkover bridge between Fry. Rd. and Peek Rd. I then rode into Freedom Park in the George Bush Park on the water control levee district.

I rode to Westheimer Parkway and checked Fisherman's Trail and Bayou View Trail on the levee.

I finished my shift by riding to and sitting near Exploration Park. I noted five vehicles in the parking lot.

I encountered no unauthorized motor vehicles on the levee this date.

Chris Bronsell;

On Wednesday, November 17, 2021, I, Deputy C. Bronsell, badge #341, worked extra employment for Willow Fork Drainage District from 3pm until 6pm. I began by patrolling the Bayou North Side Trail. I made stops at Highland Community Park and practice fields, Kilpatrick Elem, Highland pool and playground, 3300 block of Falcon Landing Blvd, Sandi Ln, and Banksfield Ct. I then traveled North and patrolled around Cinco Ranch Jr High and High School. I made rounds through the WillowFork Park parking lot, which was half full. I then made my way to the underpass of S.H. 99 and sat stationary in this area. I worked a total of 3 hours. I did not observe any motorized vehicles on the levee during my shift.

On Saturday, November 20, 2021, I patrolled the levee from 2pm until 6pm. I began by patrolling the levee from the 3300 block of Falcon Landing to Greenbusch Rd. I observed construction on the levee in this area. I then patrolled the Bayou South Side Trail, making my way to Roesner Rd. I patrolled around Cinco Ranch High School and sat stationary behind the baseball field. I watched the parking lot of Willow Fork Park, which was almost full. I then patrolled in a Southeast direction, making stops at Beck Jr. High, Summer Pointe playground and practice field, and Exploration Park. I sat stationary on the levee and watched the parking lot of Exploration, which was completely full. I patrolled around Camp Cinco and made my way to Freedom Park. I patrolled around the Equestrian Center and around the North Lake Village pool and tennis courts. I worked a total of 4 hours. I did not observe any motorized vehicles on the levee during my shift.

Fernie Flores;

On November 18, 2021, I started my shift at Exploration Park where there were 7 vehicles parked on the lot. I traveled the levee around Camp Cinco Point without incident. I remained in the area between Camp Cinco Point and the pedestrian bridge for an extended period without incident. I crossed the pedestrian bridge toward Freedom Park where there was thin traffic on the paths. Freedom Park had one field in use and mild pedestrian traffic. I traveled toward Kelliwood Green where the paths were bare possibly due to the cooler weather. I remained in the area between Kelliwood Greens and the pedestrian bridge for an extended period without incident. I traveled toward Willow Fork Park where the paths had mild pedestrian traffic. The foot traffic increased as I approached Willow Fork Park. There were 24 vehicles parked at Willow Fork Park. I remained in the area for an extended period without incident. No security was observed while on location. I traveled to Highland Park pool without incident. The pool is busy with swim practice in progress. I patrolled toward Beck Jr High School and crossed the pedestrian bridge without incident. The school lot was busy with staff and parents. I remained in the area between Beck Jr High School and the pedestrian bridge for an extended period without incident. I moved past Beck Jr High School toward Exploration Park. Exploration Park had 6 vehicles on the lot and the Park had mild traffic. I remained in the area for an extended period without incident. I patrolled back past Beck Jr High School where the lot was still busy. I then patrolled to the pedestrian bridge without incident. I remained in the area between the pedestrian bridge and Exploration Park for the remainder of my shift.

Later, I was contacted by Rosenberg Assistant Police Chief J. Neathery in reference to him catching a juvenile spray painting in the area of Fry Road and Cinco Terrace (case # 21-43472). The juvenile was identified, and his parents were contacted.

Tanner Eddleblute:

On November 19, 2021, I started riding the Willow Fork Levee at Kilpatrick Elementary School, from there I rode over to Wellington Grove Park and checked on it. I then rode over to Willow Fork Park where from about 3:30 pm till 4:00 pm I sat in the parking lot. While I was there I counted about 20 vehicles in the parking lot and I did not see anyone from on-site security while I was there. I then rode the levee to The Bowl where I crossed over the pedestrian bridge and rode the section of the levee which runs by Beck Junior High School and out to Exploration Park. From about 4:35 pm till about 5:00 pm I sat and watched the park and while I was there I counted about 22 vehicles in the parking lot. While I was there I rode over to the Cinco YMCA and checked on it. I then rode the levee down to The Point where I rounded the corner and kept riding the levee. I rode the levee to the backside of Freedom Park. After that I rode the section of the levee which runs by Kelliwood subdivision and Willow Fork Country Club. I rode that section till I ended up back at The Bowl. I did not see any motorized vehicles on the levee during my shift.

Brian Schmitt;

On November 21, 2021, I started the shift by checking behind Kilpatrick Elementary. I continued to Highland Community Park. The park was busy with soccer games. I then patrolled behind the Woodlake Estates subdivision. I checked under the Falcon Landing bridge.

I checked behind Cinco Ranch Jr. and Sr. High Schools. I went to Willow Fork Park. While at Willow Fork Park, I sat by the parking lot and watched the vehicle traffic drive in and out of the park. The vehicle count varied from 26 to 39 vehicles while I sat by the parking lot. While sitting by the parking lot, I saw and met with Sam the On-Site Security guard. After approximately an hour I continued with my patrols.

I noticed spray paint (graffiti) under the northbound side of Cinco Ranch Blvd. (Photo Included). I then went to Exploration Park. While at Exploration Park I counted 40 vehicles. I checked the entrance to the YMCA Campgrounds and the access gate to the diversion channel was closed. I then went back to Exploration Park and watched the vehicle traffic.

I then went and sat by the Renberg pedestrian bridge for a short time. I went to Freedom Park and while at Freedom Park I checked the baseball fields and concession/restroom building. I then patrolled the Army Corp. of Engineers Section. I checked the area around the tractor bridge. I continued with my patrols and then sat by the bridge at Westbrook Cinco Lane.

It started to drizzle a bit so I moved and sat just west of Cinco Ranch Blvd. close to Glenthorpe Lane.

I also sat in the treeline behind the Kings Lakes subdivision. During the shift I did not observe any motorized vehicles or suspicious activity.

Tim Oxley; (Exploration Park)

On Sunday, November 21,2021 at approximately 11:26 two vehicles arrived in the connecting parking lot. First vehicle was occupied by two females ages 20 and 21 the second vehicle was occupied by one male 21 years of age. Subjects stated they had plans to walk through the park. They were advised the park is closed after dark. Subjects left location. No further activity was observed.

On Friday, November 26, 2021, No activity was observed, (light rain).

On Saturday, November 27, 2021, No activity was observed, (light rain).

Chris Bronsell;

On Wednesday, November 24, 2021, I, Deputy C. Bronsell, badge #341, worked extra employment for Willow Fork Drainage District from 3pm until 6pm. I began by patrolling the levee around Exploration Park. I observed approx. 30 vehicles in the parking lot. I patrolled through Camp Cinco and made my way to Freedom Park, where softball games were taking place. I patrolled the levee behind Fry Ct, and sat stationary by the golf course. I patrolled around Beck Jr. High and sat stationary in this area. I patrolled around the South Ranch pool, which contained 6 vehicles. I patrolled the levee to Emily Park Ln. and sat stationary in this area. I patrolled around Summer Pointe playground and practice field. I worked a total of 3 hours. I did not observe any motorized vehicles on the levee during my shift.

Tanner Eddleblute;

On November 22, 2021, I started riding the Willow Fork Levee at Kilpatrick Elementary School, from there I rode the levee over to Willow Fork Park where from about 3:25 pm till 4:00 pm I sat in the parking lot. While I was there I counted about 42 vehicles in the parking lot and I saw Jorge with on-site security making rounds in the park. From there I rode the levee to The Bowl where from about 4:20 pm till 4:40 pm I parked by the pedestrian bridge and watched the walking path. After there I headed north on the levee riding the section of the levee which runs by Willow Fork Country club and Kelliwood subdivision. I rode that section all the way to the backside of Freedom Park and out to The Tractor Bridge. I then crossed over The Tractor Bridge and rode the Army Corps of Engineers section of the levee all the way to S Mason Rd. I then crossed the bayou over to Exploration Park. I counted about 13 vehicles in the parking lot so from about 5:55 pm till 6:15 pm I sat in the parking lot. Before I left I walked through the park to make sure no one was still in the park. I then rode the section of the levee which runs by Beck Junior High School and back to The Bowl. I did not see any motorized vehicles on the levee during my shift.

On November 23, 2021, I started riding the Willow Fork Levee at Kilpatrick Elementary School, from there I rode the levee over to Wellington Grove Park and checked on it. I then rode the levee over to Willow Fork Park where from about 3:30 pm till 4:00 pm I watched the parking lot. While I was there I counted about 28 vehicles in the parking a lot and I talked with Jorge with on-site security. Jorge told me that everything in the park is going well today. After there I rode the levee to The Bowl where I crossed over the pedestrian bridge and rode the section of the levee which runs by Beck Junior High School. I continued to ride that section of the levee till I ended up at Exploration Park from about 4:40 pm till 5:10 pm I parked and observed the park and parking lot. While I was there I counted about 43 vehicles in the parking lot. From there I rode the levee down to The Point where I rounded the corner and rode the levee to the backside of Freedom Park. I then rode the section of the levee which runs by Kelliwood subdivision and Willow Fork Country Club and ended back at The Bowl. I did not see any motorized vehicles on the levee during my shift.

On November 26, 2021, I started riding the Willow Fork Levee at Kilpatrick Elementary School, I rode the levee to The Bowl where I headed north on the levee. I rode the section of the levee which runs by Willow Fork Country Club and Kelliwood subdivision. I continued to ride that section of the levee all the way to the backside of Freedom Park and out to The Tractor Bridge. I then made my way on the levee to Exploration Park where from about 2:25 pm till 2:50 pm I sat and observed the park and parking lot. While I was there I counted about 36 vehicles in the parking lot. After there I rode the section of the levee which runs by Beck Junior High School and back to The Bowl where from 3:15 pm till 3:40 pm I sat and watched the walking path. I then rode the levee to Willow Fork Park where from 3:55 pm till 4:15 pm I sat in the parking lot. While I was there I counted about 43 vehicles in the parking lot and I saw Jorge with on-site security making rounds in the park. I did not see any motorized vehicles on the levee during my shift.

Tim Oxley; (Exploration Park)

On November 28,2021 10:00pm to 4:00am. No activity observed, (light rain).

On December 3, 2021 10: pm to 4:00 am at approximately 8:30 pm Three subjects entered the closed park area. Two females and one male all in their early twenties. They were advised of the park closing after dark, subjects left location.

At 9:05 pm Vehicle entered the connected parking area occupied by three males and one female in their late teens or early 20s. They Advised of park policy after dark. Subjects left location.

At 10:09 pm an Elderly female entered and parked in the connected parking area, when questioned she advised, "she was going for a walk till it was time to pick up her son". I requested she park further down near the processing plant till her walk was completed. She complied and left the location approximately 15 minutes later.

At 10:53 pm a female in her early 20s entered and parked in the connected parking area. She was advised of park closure after dark and she left the location.

At 10:55 pm Vehicle entered the connected parking area occupied by one male subject in early 20s. He was advised of the park closure after dark and he left the location.

At 1:35 am Vehicle entered the connected parking area and parked at the far end of the lot. Vehicle was occupied by four males subjects in their late teens or early twenties. I made contact as they exited the vehicle. They were advised the park was closed and they left the location.

On December 4, 2021 10:00 pm to 4:00 am at approximately 9:30 pm a male subject in his early 30s was observed fishing from the bank across from park, vehicle was located in the connected parking area. Made contact and requested he relocate his vehicle due to parking lot closure. Subject complied and was later met by his fishing partner also in his early 30s. Both vehicles were parked off park area property.

At 10:20 pm a vehicle entered the connected parking lot and parked at the far end near the processing plant. The vehicle was occupied by a male and female, both in their late teens. The male subject was already in the backseat upon my arrival. The subjects were advised the park was closed and they left the location.

Aramis Gonzales;

On December 30, 2021, I rode the levee and had no incidents with motor vehicles. I first rode to and sat between Stansbury Place Ln. and Summer Edge Ln. on the levee.

I then rode to the Willow Fork Park where I sat for a while observing the parking lot and park area. I further rode and checked the park perimeter and periodically checked the parking lot area. I noted two white Chevrolet trucks with workers on property. While there I further noted six vehicles in the adjacent parking lot to the park.

I checked and sat for a while near the walkover bridge between Fry. Rd. and Peek Rd. No incidents to report in this area on this date.

I further rode and sat for a while near the overpass on Westheimer Parkway due to reports of criminal mischief under the bridge area.

While riding I encountered a brown Chevrolet pickup parked on the side of Mason Rd. and the levee system. I looked further and realized that workers were in the area west of Peek Rd. trimming shrubs, and attending to the walking paths and grounds. This vehicle had a small magnetic sign on the driver's side rear door.

I rode to Westheimer Parkway and checked Fisherman's Trail and Bayou View Trail on the levee.

I then rode into Freedom Park in the George Bush Park on the water control levee district. I checked the baseball fields, parking lots and concession stand. No vehicles in the parking lot.

I finished my shift by riding to and sitting near Exploration Park where I noted three vehicles in the parking lot.

I encountered no unauthorized motor vehicles on the levee this date.

Chris Bronsell;

On Wednesday, December 01, 2021, I, Deputy C. Bronsell, badge #341, was unable to work the levee due to being called out at work for a fatality accident in the Needville area.

On Friday, December 03, 2021, I patrolled the levee from 2:30pm until 5:30pm (covered for Deputy Tanner Edelbute). I began by patrolling around Creech Elementary, The Ballard House, and Exploration Park. I observed the parking lot to contain only 4 vehicles. I patrolled around Summer Pointe playground and made my way to Beck Jr. High. I sat stationary on the levee near the bridge, located just East of Peek. I patrolled to S.H. 99 and sat stationary in this area. I patrolled the levee to Emily Park Ln. and back to Exploration. I worked a total of 3 hours. I did not observe any motorized vehicles on the levee during my shift.

On Saturday, December 04, 2021, I patrolled the levee from 11am until 4pm. I began by patrolling around the Highland pool, playground, and basketball court. I patrolled the levee to the 3300 block of Falcon Landing Blvd, where I observed some new graffiti under the overpass. I patrolled to Greenbusch Rd and then made my way back along the Bayou North Side Trail. I sat stationary near Glenthorpe Ln. I patrolled around Cinco Ranch High School and sat stationary in the parking lot of WillowFork Park. I observed the parking lot to contain 22 vehicles. I met with On-Site Security Officers Randy and Sam. located near the back of the Park. I then patrolled the levee in an East direction, sitting stationary just East of Mason Rd (near the golf course) and behind Fry Ct (near the golf course). I worked my way around Camp Cinco, checking the bridge and Fisherman's Trail. I patrolled to Exploration Park and sat stationary in the parking lot which contained 24 vehicles. I worked a total of 5 hours. I did not observe any motorized vehicles on the levee during my shift.

On Sunday, December 05, 2021, I patrolled the levee from 1pm until 5pm (covered for Deputy Brian Schmitt). I began by patrolling around the Highland Community Park and practice fields. I sat stationary behind Kilpatrick Elementary and then near the dead end of Banksfield Ct. I patrolled the Bayou South Side Trail to Roesner Rd. I patrolled around WillowFork Park, which contained 20 vehicles, and met with Security Officer Randy inside the Park. I patrolled around Beck Jr High, South Ranch Pool, Summer Pointe playground, and Exploration Park. I watched the parking lot from a distance, which contained approximately 35 vehicles. I worked a total of 4 hours. I did not observe any motorized vehicles on the levee during my shift.

Fernie Flores;

On December 2, 2021, I started my shift at Exploration Park where there were 12 vehicles parked on the lot. I traveled the levee around Camp Cinco Point without incident. I crossed the pedestrian bridge toward Freedom Park where there was thin traffic on the paths. Freedom Park had one field in use and mild pedestrian traffic. I met with a jogger in the area named Samuel who stated that he had recently observed some hunters in the area carrying rifles. It was undetermined if the rifles were air guns or centerfire. Samuel stated that he didn't hear any gunfire in the area and the Hispanic males walked a trail between Fisherman's trail and Freedom Park. I patrolled the area

for an extended period without incident. No evidence of hunters in the area was discovered.

I traveled toward Kelliwood Green and patrolled the area without incident. I remained in the area between Kelliwood Greens and the pedestrian bridge for an extended period without incident.

I traveled toward Willow Fork Park where the paths had medium pedestrian traffic. There were 30 vehicles parked at Willow Fork Park. I remained in the area for an extended period without incident. Security was observed while on location in a highly visible area. I then traveled to Highland Park pool without incident. The pool was busy with swim practice in progress.

I patrolled toward Beck Jr High School and crossed the pedestrian bridge without incident. The school lot had medium traffic. I moved past Beck Jr High School toward Exploration Park. Exploration Park had 4 vehicles on the lot and the Park had mild traffic. I remained in the area for an extended period without incident. I remained in the area between Beck Jr High School for an extended period without incident.

Tanner Eddleblute;

On November 29, 2021, I started riding the Willow Fork Levee at Kilpatrick Elementary School, from there I rode the levee to Wellington Grove Park and checked on the park. I then rode the levee to Willow Fork Park where from 3:30 pm till 4:00 pm I sat the in the parking lot. While I was there I counted about 26 vehicles in the parking lot and saw Jorge with on-site security making rounds in the park. I then rode the levee to The Bowl where I crossed over the pedestrian bridge and rode the section of the levee which runs by Beck Junior High and to Exploration Park. From 4:40 pm till 5:10 pm I sat at Exploration Park and while I was there I counted about 22 vehicles in the park lot. I then double back to S Mason Rd where I crossed the bayou and rode the Army Corps of Engineers section of the levee to The Tractor Bridge. I then rode the levee to the backside of Freedom Park. I then rode the section of the levee which runs by Kelliwood subdivision and Willow Fork Country Club and ends back at The Bowl. I did not see any motorized vehicles on the levee during my shift.

Tim Oxley; (Exploration Park)

On December 5, 2021, at approximately 11:00 pm two males in their late twenties entered the connected parking lot and parked at the far end. They were advised of park closure and left location.

On December 10, 2021, at approximately 1:00 am a two hundred and fifty pound wild boar entered the connected parking lot. It began trashing the flower bed in front of the parking lot. I attempted to make contact but the boar ran back up the bayou.

On December 11, 2021, at approximately 9:30 pm I arrived early for my shift and I observed a couple parked in the parking lot. They were in their late teens seated in the back seat. They were advised the park is closed after dark. The female subject stated she was on location of her own free will and they left the location.

Aramis Gonzales;

On December 7, 2021, I rode the levy and had no incidents with unauthorized motor vehicles.

I first rode to and sat by Rodger and Ellen Beck Junior High near the walking trail. I then rode the levee to Cinco Ranch High School and checked the Willow Fork Park where I sat for a while and noted fifteen vehicles in the adjacent parking lot. I further rode and sat for a while near the overpass on Westheimer Parkway due to

I further rode to and parked near the diversion channel and the walkover bridge between Fry Rd. and Peek Rd. due to complaints of four-wheeler traffic.

I rode back to the levee and sat near Peek Rd. and the levee watching the walking trail

I then rode to the Freedom Park in the George Bush Park on the water control district levee and checked concession stands, baseball fields and parking lot.

I then rode through and checked Camp Cinco. I further rode through and checked the YMCA camp and trail that lead to the levee.

I then rode and sat between Exploration Park and the Ballard House towards the end of the shift. I noted eight vehicles parked in the parking lot.

I encountered no unauthorized motor vehicles on the levee on this date.

On December 10, 2021, I rode the levee and had no incidents with motor vehicles. I first rode to and sat between Stansbury Place Ln. and Summer Edge Ln. on the levee.

I then rode to the Willow Fork Park where I sat for a while observing the parking lot and park area. I noted three vehicles in the parking lot on this date.

I further rode and sat for a while near the overpass on Cinco Ranch Rd. due to reports of criminal mischief under the bridge area. No incidents to report on this date.

I further rode and sat at Cassidy Park Ln. and S. Mason Rd. on the levee where I parked for a while watching the walking path.

I checked and sat for a while near the walkover bridge between Fry. Rd and Peek Rd. No incidents to report on this date.

I then rode into Freedom Park in the George Bush Park on the water control levee district and checked the park area.

I rode to Westheimer Parkway and checked Fisherman's Trail and Bayou View Trail on the levee.

I finished my shift by riding to and sitting near Exploration Park. I noted nine vehicles in the parking lot on this date.

I encountered no unauthorized motor vehicles on the levee this date.

Chris Bronsell;

On Wednesday, December 08, 2021, I, Deputy C. Bronsell, badge #341, worked extra employment for WillowFork Drainage District from 3pm until 6pm. I patrolled around the Highland Community Park and practice field. I sat stationary behind Kilpatrick Elementary, near the basketball court. I patrolled the levee to the underpass of Falcon Landing Blvd, near the 3300 block. I patrolled the levee behind Glenthorpe Ln, crossed under the overpass of Westheimer Pkwy, and patrolled around Cinco Ranch Jr. High and High School. I watched the parking lot of WillowFork Park from a distance. I then made my way to S.H 99 and sat stationary in this area. I continued patrolling the Bayou North Side Trail, making stops at Banksfield Ct and Sandi Ln. I worked a total of 3 hours. I did not observe any motorized vehicles on the levee during my shift.

Tanner Eddleblute:

On December 6, 2021, I started riding the Willow Fork Levee at Kilpatrick Elementary School, from there I rode the levee to Wellington Grove Park and checked on the park. I then rode the levee to Willow Fork Park where I counted about 8 vehicles in the parking lot. From about 3:00 pm till 3:30 pm I sat at Willow Fork Park and while I was there I saw Jorge with on-site security making rounds in the park. As I was headed to The Bowl I saw the WFL Trail sign located behind Litchfield Bend Ln. to be laying on the ground. It looks like the bolts holding it up stripped out from the base. (See picture of sign and location) I then rode the levee to The Bowl where from about 4:00 pm till 4:20 pm I sat by the pedestrian bridge and watched the walking path. From there I rode the section of the levee which runs by Willow Fork Country Club, Kelliwood subdivision, and to the backside of Freedom Park. I then rode the levee to The Point and rounded the corner and rode the levee to Exploration Park. From 5:30 pm till 6:00 pm I sat in the parking lot. While I was there I counted about 7 vehicles in the parking lot. After that I rode the section of the levee which runs by Beck Junior High School and back to The Bowl. I did not see any motorized vehicles on the levee during my shift.

On December 9, 2021, I started riding the Willow Fork Levee at Kilpatrick Elementary School, from there I then rode the levee to Willow Fork Park where I counted about 12 vehicles in the parking lot. From about 3:45 pm till 4:15 pm I sat at Willow Fork Park and while I was there I saw Jorge with on-site security making rounds in the park. I then rode the levee to The Bowl where I crossed over the pedestrian bridge and rode up on a kid that was having bike issues. I was able to fix his bike and get back to riding. I then rode the section of the levee which runs by Beck Junior High School and over to Exploration Park. From 4:55 pm till 5:30 pm I sat at Exploration Park and while I was there I counted about 22 vehicles in the parking lot. I then went back to S Mason Rd and crossed the bayou and rode the Army Corps of Engineers section of the levee down to The Tractor Bridge. I then rode the levee to the backside of Freedom Park. I then rode the section of the levee which runs by Kelliwood subdivision and Willow Fork Country Club and back to The Bowl. I did not see any motorized vehicles on the levee during my shift.

Brian Schmitt;

On December 11, 2021, I began the shift by patrolling behind Kilpatrick Elementary and continued on to Highland Community Park. It was extremely windy and pretty chilly out so I didn't see many people utilizing the trails. As I was passing over one of the Willow Fork pedestrian bridges I noticed that the WFDD sign had fallen over. It didn't appear to have been vandalized. I included a photograph and a map screenshot of the location. (I also noticed Deputy Tanner documented this sign also in one of his reports). I then checked Exploration Park. While at Exploration Park I counted 17 vehicles in the parking lot. I sat at the park for a bit and continued on my patrols. I checked the Army Corp. of Engineers Section and then went to Freedom Park. While at Freedom Park I checked the baseball fields and the concession/restroom building.

I checked the viewing platforms and the nature trails numerous times throughout the shift.

I then went and sat by the Renberg pedestrian bridge for a short time. It was really cold sitting there so I moved over by the water treatment plant on Peek Rd.

I went to Willow Fork Park. While at the park I counted 14 vehicles in the parking lot. I sat by the parking lot for almost an hour and then continued with my patrols. I did not observe any suspicious activity or motorized vehicles during the shift.

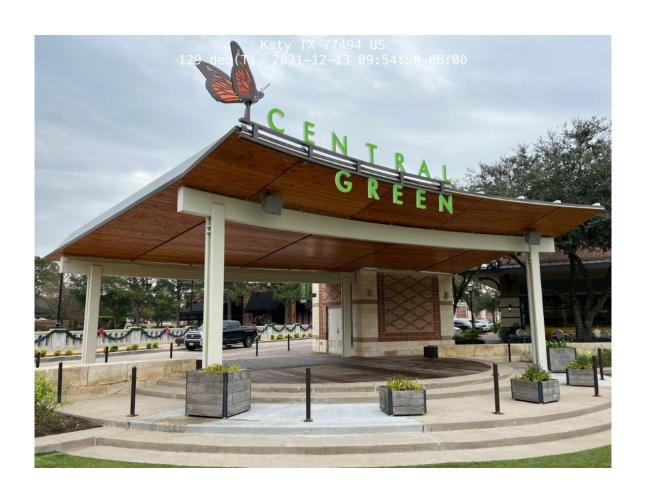
