Project Barker Update

More than 100 residents, elected officials, stakeholders and individuals interested in Project Barker—a flood reduction solution that increases flood storage in Barker reservoir—attended a town hall hosted by WFDD in December. "Project Barker aims to help solve a historic problem that has yet to be fixed by excavating Barker reservoir to allow more water to be stored during significant rainfall events," said Steve Robinson with ABHR, who serves at the District's attorney. The pilot project will also improve wetlands currently onsite, providing park enhancements and environmental educational opportunities.

WFDD has committed to issuing up to \$10 million of its authorized but unissued bonds toward the \$24 million project, which includes \$1.9 million in grant funding and a \$22.1 million, 30-year interest-free loan from the Texas Water Development Board. "We are asking MUD districts and counties within our boundary to join this effort to prevent future flooding by committing \$12 million toward repayment of this loan," said WFDD president Wendy Duncan. "Together we can demonstrate that we are a community with the collective force to protect our community from future flooding." Visit ProjectBarker.com to view a video of the town hall.


WFDD's Central Green is kicking off its spring programming with the third
