Are You Hurricane Ready?

WFDD's commitment to informing residents on preparing for storm events, especially during hurricane season, included recent participation by WFDD President Wendy Duncan at Congressman Troy Nehls Hurricane Expo. "As we enter hurricane season, I can't emphasize enough to our residents three main takeaways," said Duncan. "Have a current flood insurance policy, make a family emergency plan, and know where to find data to stay informed during a hurricane." WFDD has compiled easy-to-access resources with storm and emergency information on its website, including links to flood gauges monitoring rainfall and stream elevations, city and county emergency operations websites with alert sign-ups, and roadway flood warnings to plan travel safely during stormy weather. 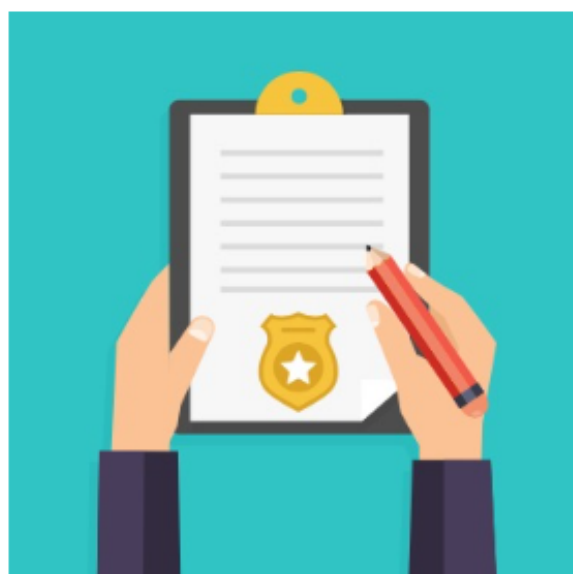
Be Informed

See Graffiti? Say Something!

While some people view graffiti as art, it is a crime. An uptick in graffiti across the District has prompted WFDD to boost efforts to catch and fine offenders who vandalize any property within its boundaries, including parks and trails and drainage structures. Violation of [WFDD Rules and Regulations](#) or [Park Rules](#) are punishable as a Class C misdemeanor with fines up to \$5,000 per day and the possibility of full restitution for property damage. "The appearance of graffiti encourages further crime," says Andrew Dunn, the WFDD's security consultant with On-Site Protection. "While WFDD removes graffiti regularly, quick reporting is helpful to identifying offenders."
