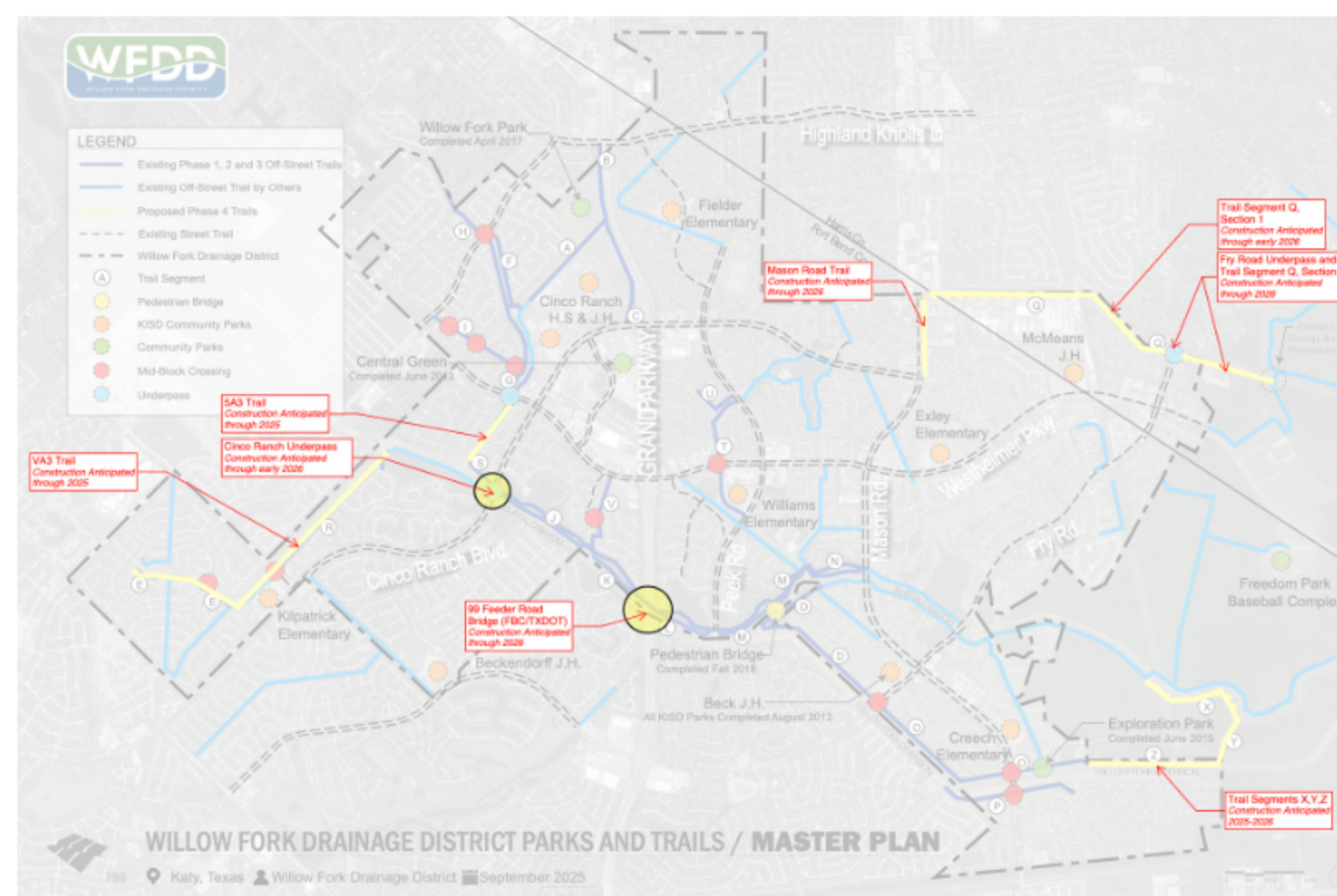

The 411 on Trail Closures/Detours



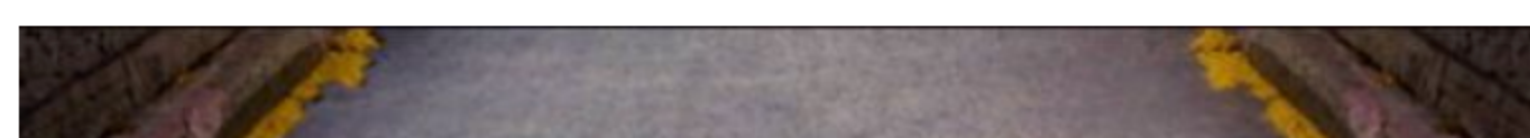
Due to ongoing and upcoming construction projects by WFDD, TxDOT and other entities, residents can expect continued temporary closures of trails in certain areas, as highlighted on the District's Master Plan Map on our website. Temporary closures and trail detours will continue in these areas throughout 2025 and into next year, including:

- Chanel Va12 rehabilitation (Cinco Ranch West, Trail Segments R & E)
- Mason Rd Sidewalk Widening (East side) from Channel T103 south to Cinco Ranch Blvd
- Trail Segment Q, Section 1 and Fry Rd Underpass at channel T103
- Trail Segments X, Y, Z
- Cinco Ranch Blvd underpass at Buffalo Bayou
- TX HWY 99 feeder road bridge installation and trail re-alignment
- Trail re-installation (East side) of Chanel Va3 by North Fort Bend Water Authority

Trail Etiquette for Electric Bikes and Scooters





Texas Transportation Code defines an electric bicycle as being equipped with fully operable pedals and an electric motor of fewer than 750 watts, with a top assisted speed of 28 miles per hour or less. Electric bike users in Texas must follow the same rules as bikers, such as riding in the bike lane, accepting all other traffic laws, and giving way to pedestrians, including on multi-use paths such as WFDD trails. Similarly, e-scooters, also called motor-assisted scooters, are required to yield right of way to pedestrians. “We have been seeing an increase in electric scooter related accidents across the county. Even though users of e-scooters are required to travel with traffic, not carry passengers, and yield to pedestrians, among other Texas laws, pedestrians are being hit at an alarming rate,” said Andrew Dunn of On-Site Protection, who oversees District security. “Small children and pets are also becoming frequent victims of high-speed e-scooter driving.” WFDD encourages residents to responsibly share the road and for riders and pedestrians to be aware of their surrounding when on the trails. E-vehicle laws are continuing to evolve, and while WFDD currently permits e-bikes and scooters, it continues to prohibit off-road motor vehicles, including dirt bikes, ATVs or golf carts.
